## PRINCETON WALK RECREATION CENTER RULES AND REGULATIONS

### General

1. All persons using the facilities of the Princeton Walk Recreation Village do so at their own risk. The Princeton Walk Recreation Village will not be responsible for accident, injury, or loss of property through theft or damage.
2. The lifeguards and clubhouse staff have complete authority in the supervision of the swimming pools and Recreation Village facilities.
3. Owners shall be responsible for property damage caused by themselves, members of their family, their tenants and/or their guests. The cost of such damages shall be charged to the responsible owner.
4. Parking is permitted only in authorized areas. There is **NO PARKING ALONG PROMENADE BOULEVARD**. Vehicles parked in marked handicapped parking spaces must display proper registration to do so.
5. These rules and regulations may be amended at any time by the Board of Trustees.
6. All suggestions and complaints concerning the operation of the Princeton Walk Recreation Facility should be directed to the Board of Trustees or the Recreation Manager.

### Membership

1. Residents, tenants and/or guests must display a current Princeton Walk Recreation Village POOL TAG to use the amenities of the Association recreation complex.
2. Pool tags will be issued to only those members in good standing.
3. Except as otherwise provided for in these rules and regulations, the use of the recreation complex is restricted to unit owners, tenants, members of their immediate families who are legally domiciled with them throughout the year and authorized guests.
4. Each person must sign in with the gatekeeper, clubhouse monitor, or lifeguard.
5. ONE tag is required PER PERSON for anyone entering or using the recreation facility. Pool tags must be presented to the lifeguard, clubhouse monitor, or badge checker when entering any of the Princeton Walk Recreation Village facilities.
6. Residents must have an electronic key fob to access the clubhouse or other recreation village facilities.

### Guests in the Recreation Building and at the pool

1. Any person who is not a resident of Princeton Walk, the Preserve at Princeton Walk, or the Woods at Princeton Walk is considered a guest.
2. All guests must be accompanied by a resident while the guest is using any of the Princeton Walk Recreation Village facilities. Residents may not 'drop off' or leave a guest at the facility; if the sponsoring resident leaves, the guest must leave.
3. A resident must be at least **18** years old to sponsor another adult guest in the **fitness room**.
4. Residents or guests under the age of 14 must be accompanied by a resident **18** years old or older when using the pool.
5. Residents who are 14 years old and above may sponsor a guest at the pool; the guest(s) must also be 14 years old or above.

### Rules of Conduct - POOL

1. No one is permitted in the pool or pool area when the lifeguard is not on duty.
2. Each resident is responsible for keeping the pool, grass area, deck and clubhouse tidy.
3. No running, pushing, ball playing or any other rough behavior will be allowed in the pool or surrounding area.
4. Absolutely no diving is permitted.
5. Jumping into the kiddie pool will not be permitted.
6. Alcoholic beverages are not permitted at any time.
7. No pets are allowed on pool property. Pets may not be tied to the fence.
8. Abusive or profane language shall not be used in the Princeton Walk Recreation Village.
9. No chairs, tables, or lounge chairs are permitted within 6 feet of the pool perimeter so that lifeguards have unobstructed access to the pool.
10. The lifeguards' primary responsibility is to look after the safety of all within the pool enclosure. Members and guests should not distract the lifeguards from their duties.
11. Music may not be played aloud; headphones must be used.
12. The lifeguards and/or Clubhouse Administrators are empowered to manage the Pool area, and all instructions must be followed. Failure to observe the rules or follow staff direction will result in loss of privileges for the day and potentially could result in revocation of pool privileges for the remainder of the season.

### Health and Safety

1. Any person showing evidence of skin disease, sore or inflamed eyes, cold, nasal or ear discharge, or any communicable disease shall be refused admission to the pool.
2. Persons with excessive sunburn, open blisters, cuts or bandages shall be refused admission.
3. Rough play or other conduct affecting the comfort and safety of others will not be permitted.
4. Where food and drink are allowed, only non-glass containers shall be allowed.  
Metal or other hard objects or toys, INCLUDING WATER GUNS, are not allowed in either pool.  
***NO FOOD/DRINK EXCEPT WATER IN A PLASTIC BOTTLE OR CONTAINER IS ALLOWED IN THE INDOOR POOL!***
5. All bathers must shower before entering either pool. **This is a requirement of the State of New Jersey State Sanitary Code, Chapter IX. We do not have the authority to waive this rule.**
6. Masks, fins, snorkels and other swimming accessories will be permitted only with lifeguard permission.
7. In the event of a thunderstorm, the lifeguard will remove all swimmers from the water at the first sign of the storm. Swimmers will not be permitted to return to the water until at least 30 minutes after the last sign of the storm.
8. Trash is to be disposed of in the containers provided.
9. No bicycles, in-line skates, or other vehicles are permitted within the pool enclosure.
10. Proper bathing attire (swimsuit) is required at all times; no street clothing is permitted. No T-shirts, cut-offs, or tennis apparel is permitted. Unitard type apparel, if specifically intended as bathing attire, is permitted.
11. All untrained children must wear swim diapers with rubber pants, as per the New Jersey Sanitary code.
12. Persons suspected of being under the influence of alcohol or other drugs shall be denied admission to any of the Princeton Walk Recreation Village facilities.
13. Smoking is not permitted in the pool area (perimeter fence) or in the Clubhouse.
14. All persons entering the indoor pool must wear crocs or swim appropriate shoes. **STREET SHOES ARE NOT ALLOWED.**

### Pool Hours and Operation

1. The hours of operation for both the indoor and outdoor pools are posted by the pool and copies are located in the lobby of the clubhouse.
2. The lifeguards, in conjunction with the Board of Trustees or Management Company, may designate hours for special events, including, but not limited to, periods of adult only swimming.
3. The pool may be closed for maintenance, health conditions, weather, or any reason deemed necessary by the lifeguard, Management Company, or Board of Trustees.

### Pool Safety & responsibility

1. Use of the kiddy pool is restricted to children 5 years of age and younger. Children using the kiddy pool must be directly supervised at all times by an adult other than the lifeguard or pool management company.
2. When not a parent, an adult resident may supervise a maximum of two children under the age of 10.
3. A parent may not supervise more than 4 children under the age of 10 at the main or kiddy pool, and cannot supervise non-swimming children in both the kiddy pool and the main pool at the same time. .
4. **Parents are responsible for their children at all times.**  
**Children under the age of 6 AND children of any age who have not passed a swimming test administered by a lifeguard, may swim in the adult (& indoor) pool ONLY WHEN ACCOMPANIED IN THE WATER BY A PARENT. The use of 'swimmies', life vests or other flotation devices DOES NOT relieve a parent or adult guardian from the responsibility to closely supervise their children in the water.**

### Flotation Devices

Flotation Devices are allowed under these guidelines:

1. "Swimmies" and Swim sweaters (vests with inner tubes) are permitted if the child's parent or designated adult is **in the pool ready to assist the child if the need arises. The child must be within arm's reach of the adult. The adult may not be sitting in a chair nearby.** Adults may only watch two children with 'swimmies' or other flotation device at a time.
2. **Small** infant seats are permitted, with a parent present in the water with the child at all times.
3. Any **large flotation devices** that impair the ability of the lifeguard to completely and clearly observe swimmers in the pool **are prohibited**. The lifeguards are empowered to make this decision.
4. Foam 'Noodles' are permitted as a convenience item, but under no circumstances may they be used as a flotation device for any person who is unable to swim.

### **Tennis and Basketball Court Rules**

1. Pool tags must be visible while on the courts or residents have the right to question your presence.
2. A resident must accompany guests at all times.
3. No bicycles, roller skates, roller blades, or skateboards are allowed on the courts.
4. **ONLY TENNIS is allowed on the tennis courts.** No other use is permitted.
5. Sign-up is on a first come, first served basis.
6. Reservations can be made by putting homeowner's name and address on the board for the specific court.
7. One hour time slots will be available for homeowner's to reserve any one of the tennis courts.
8. A homeowner's address cannot appear on more than one reservation board at any given time. This means that a household can reserve only one slot on one of the three courts at any given point.
9. Players are welcome to put their name on the reservation board again once their playing time has expired.
10. If other parties without a previous reservation for that time period are present and want to play on that court, further use of the tennis court by an existing party should be limited to an additional 60 minutes.
11. The owner of the time slot will forfeit it if not immediately available to use the slot. If the homeowner who reserved the slot is not available at the time, it shall be taken over by the next person waiting who, in turn, will forfeit his/her slot on any of the boards if reserved.
12. If there are no names on the board, the homeowner interested in playing will make an entry on the board for a time slot starting an hour after and inform the players on the court.
13. It is the duty of the players on each court to be aware of the reservations for that particular court.
14. A family member may book a court on behalf of another family member.
15. A resident may not book a slot on behalf of a person residing in a different household.
16. A member of the household should be playing on the court during the time slot booked for that address.
17. Residents may avail of private coaching facilities subject to the one hour time slot mentioned above.

### **Fitness Room Rules**

1. Be considerate of others by returning your weights, etc. to proper locations.
2. Use a towel on benches... for your sanitation and others. Wipe down the equipment after use with the disinfectant spray and paper towels provided.
3. Limit use of equipment to **THIRTY** minutes when others are waiting to use it.
4. The fitness room television volume should be kept at a moderate level so other people will not be disturbed. The use of headphones is required at all times when listening to electronic devices other than the fitness room television.
5. No profanity, no bare feet or sandals, no food or glass containers are allowed.
6. Dispose of empty bottles, tissue, paper towels, etc, in proper receptacles.
7. If you do not know how to use the fitness equipment, please contact desk personnel for instruction manual.
8. If you experience a problem with any of the fitness equipment, please notify the Recreation Manager.
9. No one under the age of 15 is permitted to ENTER the fitness room.
10. Anyone age 15 must be accompanied by an adult to use the fitness room.
11. Anyone ages 16 or 17 may use the fitness room only if a parental release form has been signed.
12. No resident under the age of 18 may sponsor a guest in the fitness room, and no guest under the age of 18 years of age may use the fitness room.
13. No use of cellphone while using the fitness equipment or working out in the fitness room.
